As from 2008 we hope to have a yearly fund raising event, so we really need your support.

This year we intend re-designing our publicity literature and our website. Now I turn to what has happened during the past year:

Our income again has been mostly from the car boot sales and agricultural rents, with the usual donation from Swallowfield Horticultural Society, but personal donations are few and far between.

We have supported local agricultural shows by taking out full page advertisements in their various programmes.

We have given another substantial donation to Berkshire Association of Young Farmers Clubs.

We supported for the second year running, a weekend educational camp for YFC members—it was good to see they had fun as well as learning.



For the third year, we have supported a pupil at Brymore School in Somerset, and we are thrilled with his progress and change in attitude. He has excelled in blacksmithing



Also in 2006 we sent a second payment of three, to a woman in Northumberland doing a BSc degree in agriculture, and who we considered was deserving of this as she intends her future career to be in agricultural education.

Again from Northumberland we have supported a single man on a Diploma of Agriculture course, but the course is at Hartpury College in Gloucestershire.

As you can see we are supporting more and more applicants outside the county of Berkshire and last year we made our first donation to a charity in South Africa. Please be assured though that one of our trustees had visited the charity and its working members and we are confident that our money was put to good use, which unfortunately can be one of the down sides of sending donations abroad.
