Our AGM in 2014 was at White House Farm in July and we all sat outside, very pleasant. There were two people attended in addition to the committee.

I would like to thank our committee and also one or two 'friends' of the Bowyer Trust for all their help at events last year.

During 2014 we received less than half the private donations for 2013, amounting to £120. We received a £1,000 donation from Swallowfield Horticultural Society, but we did not have nearly enough Car Boot Sales so our income was down there too.

However we had made donations of nearly £10,000 to March 2013 because we had had £2,000 returned from previous year when a boy did not stay at Brymore, and followed this up with support for two more boys at Brymore School and two other grants to older boys at colleges.

We also continue to support other Agricultural Associations by paying for an advert in their schedules, and Berkshire YFC received another cheque for county wide use in addition to BFMT sponsoring rosettes for their County Fayre 2014.

What happened in 2014? Brymore

New committee members Tim & Linda Chambers joined David & Maureen Bowyer on a visit to the school in June, and I quote some of their report:

'3 of our sponsored boys, Triston, Harry and Callum were very proud to show us around the school, even though they had only been there from the previous September they answered all our questions. We were most impressed with the walled garden from which the college use produce for the dining room and we also got involved with soil analysis which some students were in the process of doing with the tutor. The boys took us back to the Headmaster's study for lunch with him and the master in charge of the boarders. Then after lunch the boys showed us around the metalwork, woodwork and farm. All in all a wonderful and impressive day.'

Berks YFC Country Fayre - 2014

A few of the committee attended with a promotional stand within the Clubs stand, and also had decorating a gingerbread man for the children. We might only have made £32 but some good 'networking' went on.

Swallowfield Show - 2014

As can be seen from the two photos above the Sunday was a splendid day both for weather and subsequent sales, but Monday was as predicted VERY wet, the wettest the show has ever known.

Some brave souls did brave the weather and two of our helpers took a tray with cakes around the other marquees, more than once, and managed to sell everything.

Unbelievably we made £87 more than last year - £1,320.
